- Did I enjoy this approach?

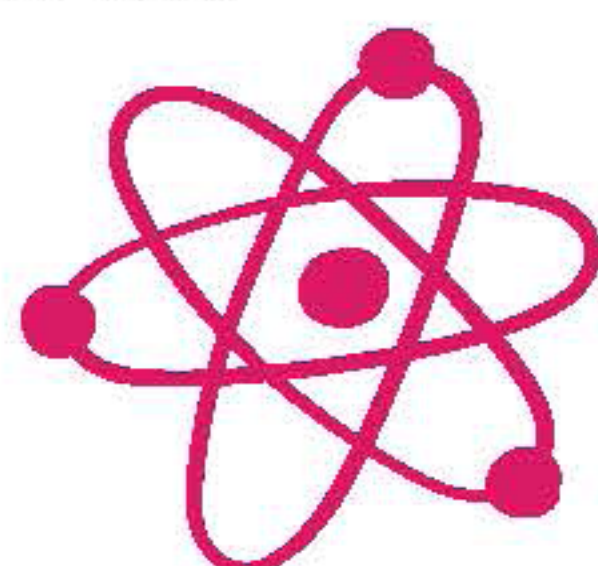
Use a journal, voice notes, or weekly check-ins to spot patterns. Which strategies feel natural and connect with the learners?
