Algebraic expressions

An algebraic expression is a combination of variables, numbers and mathematical operations.

An algebraic expression can have the following parts:

The coefficient is the part of the term other than the variable.

A variable is a place holder for a number; the value can vary. We represent a variable with a letter, e.g. x or y .

Mathematical operations: $+, -, \times, \div$

A constant is a fixed number, such as 5 or 24.

Algebraic rules:

We do not need to write the multiplication sign when we multiply variables, e.g. $4 \times m \times n \times 3$ is written as $12mn$.

We write letters in alphabetical order and numbers in front of the letters in a term, e.g. $2 \times x \times x \times 4$ is written as $8x^2$.

Types of algebraic expressions

Named according to the number of terms they contain

Polynomials:
Algebraic expression consisting of one or more terms of which exponents are natural numbers

Types of polynomial expressions

Monomial
Mono = 1
A monomial is an expression with 1 term.
e.g. $3x$, $\frac{5y}{2}$

Binomial
Bi = 2
A binomial is an expression with 2 terms.
e.g. $5x + 3$

Trinomial
Tri = 3
A trinomial is an expression with 3 terms.
e.g. $x^2 + x - 6$

Language and algebraic expressions

teaches you about the problem-solving skill in mathematics

✓ The sum of a certain number and 10 ($x + 10$)
✓ Increasing a certain number by 9 ($x + 9$)
✓ Five more than an unknown number ($5 + x$)

✓ The difference between a certain number and 4 ($x - 4$)
✓ An unknown number decreased by 30 ($x - 30$)
✓ Twenty less than a certain number ($x - 20$)

✓ The product of a certain number and 7 ($x \times 7$)
✓ Twice a certain number ($2x$)
✓ Ten more than two times an unknown number ($2x + 10$)
✓ The quotient when a certain number is divided by 8 ($\frac{x}{8}$ or $x \div 8$)
✓ The square of the difference between p and q ($(p - q)^2$)

Simplification of algebraic expressions

Combining like terms (same variable raised to the same power)

Let us work through these examples

Simplify the expression: $3x + 7x - 25$
 $3x + 7x$ can be written as:
 $x + x + x + x + x + x + x + x = 10x$
these are like terms, therefore it's like adding coefficients of x .
Therefore, the answer is: $10x - 25$

Simplify: $x^2 + 5x^2 + 2x^2$
 $x^2 + x^2 + x^2 + x^2 + x^2 + x^2$
Adding like terms: $6x^2$

Distributive law:
Simplify using distribution
e.g. $2(4p) + 4p = 2(10p) = 20p$

Simplify the following algebraic expressions:
 $-3ab^2 - 4ab^2 - 2ab^2$
 $= -3ab^2(1 + 1 + 1) - 2ab^2$
 $= -12ab^2 - 2ab^2$
 $= -2ab^2(6 + 1)$

 $\sqrt{x^2} = x^1$ and $\sqrt[3]{x^3} = x^1$ indicates the SURD form and n th root.

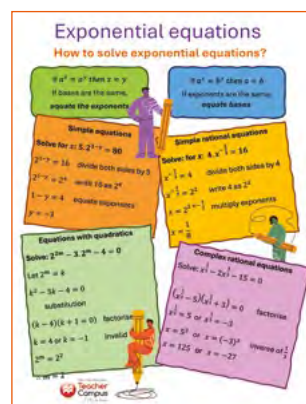
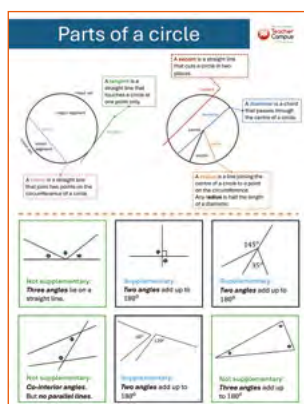
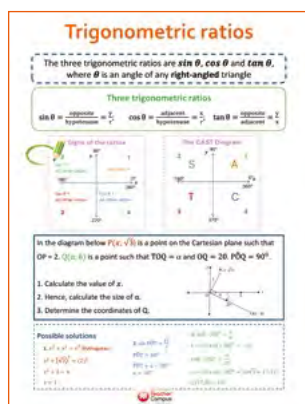

Electric circuits: Ohm's Law

$V = IR$
According to Ohm's Law, current flow is increased by voltage and decreased by resistance at constant temperature.

Ohmic Resistors:
The resistance remains constant regardless of the applied voltage or current, so the graph of voltage versus current is a straight line.

Non-Ohmic Resistors:
These resistors exhibit a curve in their voltage versus current graph, indicating resistance variation due to factors like temperature, material properties, or device type.

Factors causing resistance variation in ohmic and non-ohmic conductors

- Temperature of a conductor
- Type of material
- Length of a conductor
- Surface area of a conductor

The mole
Mole is the SI unit used to measure the amount of a substance.

It refers to a quantity that contains 6.022×10^{23} particles, such as atoms, molecules, ions, or electrons.

One mole is described as the amount of substance having the same number of particles as there are atoms in 12 g of carbon-12.

How do you find the number of atoms, molecules or particles (using moles)?

The mole allows chemists to count particles by weighing them, as it's impractical to count individual atoms or molecules due to their incredibly small size.

For example: 1 mole of carbon (C) contains 6.022×10^{23} carbon molecules, and it weighs approximately 12 grams.

1 mole of carbon atoms = 12 grams = 6.022×10^{23} atoms

Application

What mass of carbon dioxide forms in the reaction of 25 grams of glucose with 40 grams of oxygen from a respiration process?

$C_6H_{12}O_6 + 6O_2 \rightarrow 6CO_2 + 6H_2O$

Every 1 mole of glucose ($C_6H_{12}O_6$) requires 6 moles of oxygen to obtain 6 moles of carbon dioxide and 6 moles of water.

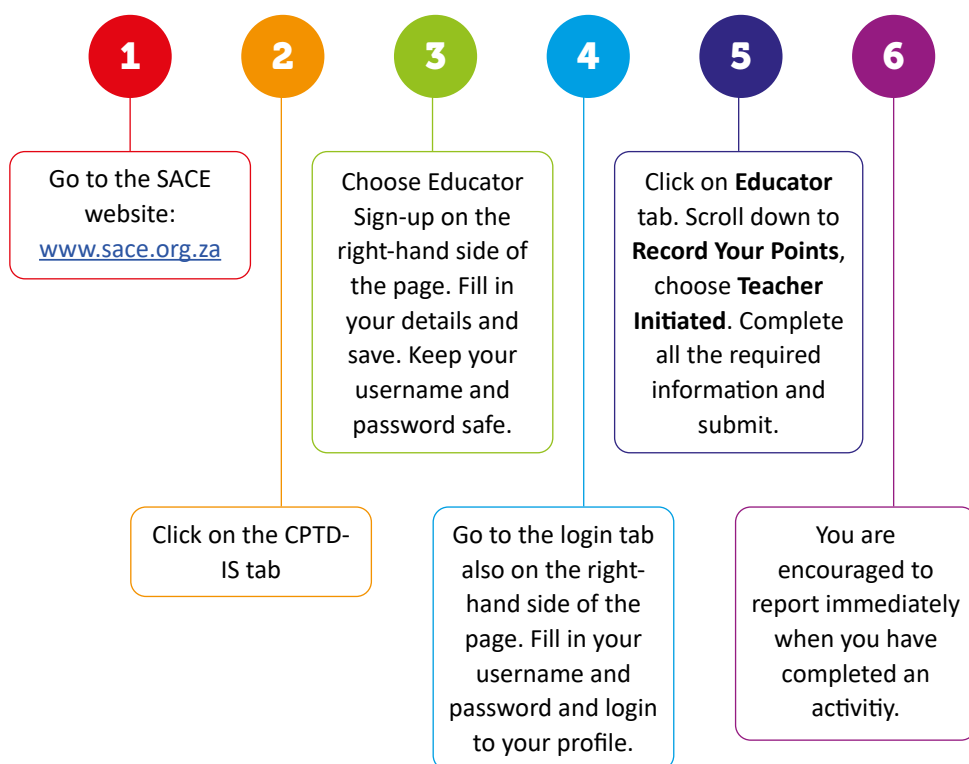

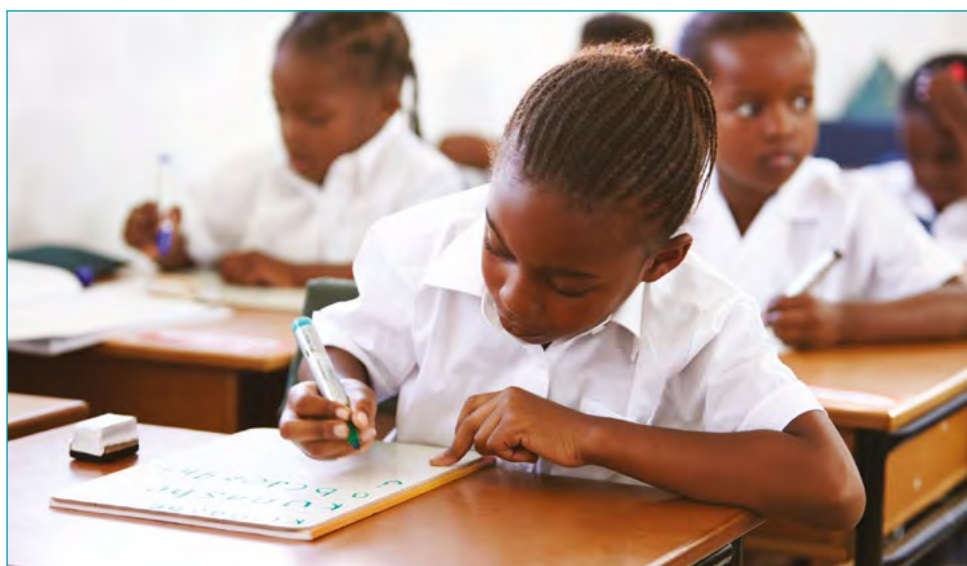

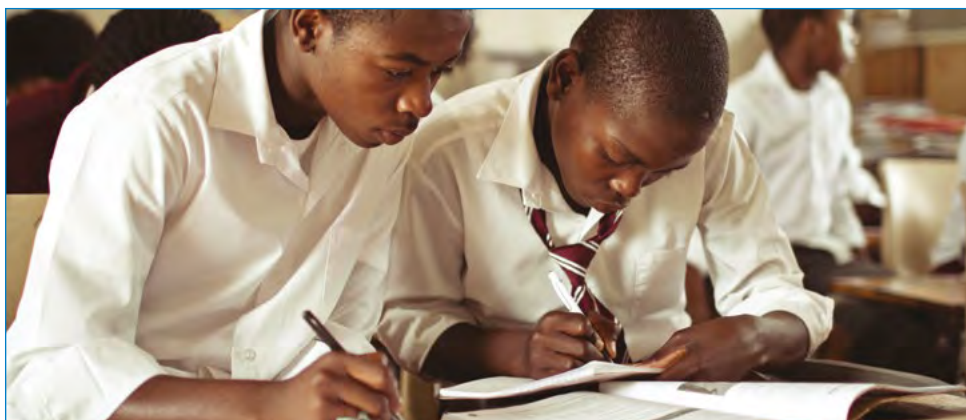
